Willie Baldwin

Dedicated husband and supporter of a wife with cicatricial alopecia

Victoria Barbosa, MD, MPH, MBA

Dr. Victoria Barbosa is the founder of Millennium Park Dermatology and an Assistant Professor in the Rush University Department of Dermatology. She holds an undergraduate degree from Harvard College and a medical degree from the Yale University School of Medicine. She completed an internship in internal medicine at the Massachusetts General Hospital, and completed her residency in dermatology at Yale. She went on to enjoy a research fellowship as a Robert Wood Johnson Clinical Scholar at the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine, where she also earned a Master's Degree in Public Health from the Johns Hopkins School of Hygiene and Public Health. Dr. Barbosa later earned a Master's Degree in Business Administration from Northwestern University's Kellogg School of Management. She is an internationally recognized expert in hair and scalp disorders, ethnic skin disorders, and cosmetics and cosmeceuticals. As both a respected authority and a gifted communicator, Dr. Barbosa has lectured at countless scientific meetings and community events, has appeared on numerous local and national radio and television broadcasts, and is often quoted in magazines and newspapers including the New York Times, the Chicago Tribune, the Chicago Sun Times, Essence and Ebony Magazines, to name a few. She has co-authored The Reader's Digest Guide to Skin Care which had been met with praise for being enlightening and easy-to-read. She has also co-edited Skin of Color, a textbook published by Springer last year. One of the few dermatologists in the country who is also a cosmetics industry insider, Dr. Barbosa was formerly a Vice President in Research and Development at the global beauty giant L'Oréal. She serves as a scientific advisor to the Cicatricial Alopecia Research Foundation, on the board of the North American Hair Research Society and on the Board of Trustees of Dillard University.

Mary Clay, MS

Mary Clay is the Director of the Transfusion Medicine Research and Development Program at the University of Minnesota Medical School. Her experience as a research scientist and administrator spans a period of 42 years and a range of responsibilities directed at managing and conducting research studies and clinical trials sponsored by the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute, several biotechnology companies and the American Red Cross Biomedical Services. Her diagnosis of lichen planopilaris in 2006 was both her introduction to CARF and her CARF immersion therapy as she became involved with the planning and conductance of the CARF Patient - Doctor Conference that was held in Minneapolis that year. As a scientist, she is very familiar with the proposed inflammatory mechanisms associated with cicatricial alopecia and, as a patient, she understands the magnitude of the psychological and emotional distress associated with scarring hair loss. Over the past 8 years patient support has been a primary focus of her sustaining involvement with CARF and is now her initiative as a member of CARF's Board of Directors.

Maria Colavincenzo, MD

Dr. Colavincenzo is a board-certified general medical dermatologist with a special interest in hair loss (alopecia). She also has expertise in the detection and treatment of skin cancer and benign skin growths, and management of acne, eczema, and many other skin conditions. Dr. Colavincenzo completed her undergraduate degree in biology at Princeton University, attended medical school at the University of Pennsylvania, and completed an internship in internal medicine at Northwestern Memorial Hospital. Following her dermatology residency at the Weill Cornell Medical Center/New York Presbyterian Hospital in New York City, Dr. Colavincenzo joined the full-time faculty as an Assistant Professor of clinical dermatology at Cornell before joining the full-time faculty at Northwestern in 2009.

SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES

Lady Dy, MD

Dr. Lady C. Dy is a board certified dermatologist and dermatopathologist. She is an associate professor of dermatology, the director of dermatopathology and the residency program director of the dermatology program at Rush University Medical Center. Dr. Dy has expertise in hair disorders, scalp diseases and ethnic and skin and scalp conditions. With her expertise in dermatopathology, Dr. Dy 's medical practice provides a combined clinical and histologic approach in diagnosing hair and scalp diseases in all skin types. Dr. Dy received her BS degree, Magna Cum Laude, in Biomedical Sciences and an Master's in Science with highest distinction in Biological Sciences from Western Michigan Univeristy. She obtained her medical degree from the highly regarded McMaster University Medical School in Ontario, Canada. Following medical school, she completed an internship in Internal Medicine at Spectrum Health System in Grand Rapids, MI and a basic science research fellowship in Dermatology at Indiana University School of Medicine. She stayed at Indiana University and completed a Dermatology residency followed by a fellowship in Dermatopathology at the University of Chicago, Pritzker School of Medicine. During her graduate studies and post-graduate medical training Dr. Dy became a clinical studies co-investigator in the Clinical Outpatient Research Center at Indiana University Medical Center, an instructor in skin care and prevention in the Indianapolis community and an assistant attending in Dermatology at Moi University in Kenya. She joined the Department of Dermatology at RUSH University Medical Center in 2003. Since her appointment Dr. Dy has lectured and presented nationally on various topics on hair. She has also published numerous articles and has written book chapter on the biology of hair, ethnic hair and office diagnosis of hair shaft diosrders. Dr. Dy is fluent in various Chinese dialects as well as Tagalog, the native language of the Philippines.

Sharon P. Foley, PhD, RD, LDN

Sharon Foley, PhD, RD, is an assistant professor in the Department of Clinical Nutrition at Rush University Medical Center, Chicago, Illinois. Previous to her appointment at Rush she worked at Hines VA Hospital in a variety of positions including nutrition support specialist, Clinical Manager, Dietetic Internship Director, and Assistant Director of Nutrition and Food Services. She has served as Co-Chair on both the Research and Professional Oversight Sub-Committee and the Education Sub-Committee of the National Advisory Board, Nutrition & Food Services, Department of Veterans Affairs. She has been a Site Visitor for many years and board member of the Accreditation Council for Education in Nutrition and Dietetics (ACEND). She currently teaches courses in statistics, research methodology, management, leadership, and metabolism at Rush. Her research interests include assessing psychometric properties of measures using Rasch analysis.

Lynne J. Goldberg, MD *Professor of Dermatology and Pathology and Laboratory Medicine, Boston University School of Medicine*

Dr. Goldberg attended medical school at Downstate Medical Center in New York, and then went on to complete residencies in both Internal Medicine at New York University and Dermatology at the Albert Einstein College of Medicine. She relocated to Boston in 1992 to train in Dermatopathology at Boston University under Dr. Jag Bhawan. Following her fellowship, she joined the Dermatology faculty at Boston University School of Medicine, where she is currently a Professor of Dermatology and Pathology and Laboratory Medicine. Dr. Goldberg divides her time between the practices of dermatopathology and clinical dermatology. She has a special interest in alopecia, and runs the Hair Clinic at Boston Medical Center.

Daniel Groth *Clinical Research Fellow at the Department of Dermatology, University of Minnesota; 4th year medical student at the Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai.*

Daniel has spent the last year researching cicatricial and non-cicatricial alopecias, with a focus on examining how cutaneous innervation and neurogenic inflammation may affect these diseases. After his research fellowship ends, Daniel will return to NYC to complete his last year of medical school at Mount Sinai. Prior to medical school, he spent one year in South Korea teaching English on a Fulbright Grant. Daniel will return to Korea this spring to present at the Korean Hair Research Society Meeting.

Maria Hordinsky, MD *Professor and Chair of the Department of Dermatology, University of Minnesota*

Dr. Hordinsky is nationally and internationally recognized for her expertise and research in hair diseases and the peripheral nervous system as it relates to hair follicle biology. Dr. Hordinsky completed her dermatology residency at the University of Minnesota Medical School. Additional training in translational and clinical research was subsequently supported with a fellowship from the Dermatology Foundation and then a National Research Service Award from the National Institute of Health. Dr. Hordinsky is Chair of the Clinical Research Advisory Council of the National Alopecia Areata Foundation, a member of the Scientific Advisory Board, Cicatricial Alopecia Research Foundation, and Secretary Treasurer to the North American Hair Research Society. Currently she is also President of the Association of Professors of Dermatology.

Amanda S. Kleinman, MD

Dr. Kleinman is an assistant professor of Psychiatry and Dermatology at Rush University Medical Center in Chicago, Illinois. Dr. Kleinman attended medical school at Northwestern University in Chicago and completed a psychiatry residency at the University of Washington in Seattle. Dr. Kleinman joined Rush in 2007 as the Director of Outpatient Psychiatry, overseeing growth and development of the central outpatient clinic and transforming resident education in the outpatient setting. Dr. Kleinman additionally has served as an Assistant Program Director for the Psychiatry Residency at Rush University. Dr. Kleinman entered the field of Psychodermatology in 2009, partnering with Dermatologists Dr. Michael Tharp of Rush University and Dr. Warren Piette of John H. Stroger Jr. Hospital of Cook County. Special areas of interest include hair loss, unresolvable itch and delusions of parasitosis. Dr. Kleinman will be entering private practice in July 2014, practicing general psychiatry and psychodermatology.

Brendan Mattson, DAOM, L.Ac,

Brendan Mattson is the Chair of the Herbal Medicine Department at Pacific College of Oriental Medicine in Chicago Illinois, where he also teaches classes in Traditional Chinese Medicine theory, Tai Chi, and herbal medicine. Brendan studied Chinese language, history, and philosophy at DePaul University before going on the masters and doctorate programs in Acupuncture and Oriental Medicine at Bastyr University in Seattle. Brendan practices acupuncture, bodywork, and Chinese herbal medicine at Ravenswood Healing Arts, specializing in integrative care for cancer patients.

Amy J. McMichael, MD

Dr. McMichael is a Professor of Dermatology at Wake Forest Baptist Health in Winston-Salem, NC. She has published numerous articles and book chapters in the area of scalp and hair disorders, as well as quality of life issues surrounding disorders of pigmentation. She is currently listed in Best Doctors in America and is a diplomat of the American Board of Dermatology. She has also served on several editorial review boards and presently is a contributing editor for *Cosmetic Dermatology* as well as the continuing medical education editor for *The Dermatologist*. She is Program Director and Chair of dermatology at Wake Forest Baptist.

Mette H. Menotti

Mette Menotti originally from Copenhagen, Denmark founded World Hair Institute in Chicago, IL. The Institute works solely with clients that are in need of Hair Addition, Non-Surgical Hair Replacement, and Combinations by providing customized solutions that do not damage and in many situations improves the client's existing hair. Mette's journey into Hair Addition began when she went through the devastation of thinning; she lost about 40% of her hair when she was 20. Fortunately some of it returned. Due to the many specialized Methods developed by Mette, clients are local but also come from further away; Kentucky, New York, Florida, Nebraska and the Canary Islands. World Hair Institute also works within the community by partnering with among others Wigs For Kids and the American Cancer Society's Look Good Feel Better program.

Stavonnie S.L. Patterson, MD

Dr. Patterson is an assistant professor of dermatology at Northwestern University Feinberg School of Medicine. She received her undergraduate degree in Biology from Stanford University and attended Morehouse School of Medicine. Dr. Patterson completed a residency in Internal Medicine at Brigham and Women's Hospital of the Harvard Medical School. Following this training she worked as a hospitalist at the Dallas Veterans Affairs Medical Center. She then went on to complete her dermatology residency at Duke University Hospital where she served as Chief Resident. Dr. Patterson is board certified in both internal medicine and dermatology. Her clinical interests include ethnic skin care, hair loss disorders and medical dermatology.

Vera H. Price, MD, F.R.C.P.C

Vera Price is Professor of Dermatology at the University of California, San Francisco. Her special expertise is in hair and hair biology. Dr. Price received her medical degree from the University of Toronto, Canada, and trained in Dermatology at New York University Postgraduate Medical School. She is credited with describing several new hair disorders. Dr. Price is co-founder of two non-profit organizations, the Cicatricial Alopecia Research Foundation (CARF) and the National Alopecia Areata Foundation (NAAF). She is a fervent advocate of patient support organizations and is keenly aware of the huge role they play in the lives of many patients. She is also a founding member of the North American Hair Research Society. Dr. Price recently coauthored a book with Dr. Paradi Mirmirani, entitled "Cicatricial Alopecia: An Approach to Diagnosis and Management", published in May, 2011. This book is the first devoted to this topic and DVD copies of the book have been donated to dermatology residents in the U.S. and Canada.

Carlos J. Puig, DO

Founding member of the International Society of Hair Restoration Surgery. Over the years, Houston hair restoration specialist, Dr. Puig has presented papers, workshops and surgical demonstrations on many topics including: female Hair Restoration, Complex Hair Transplant Case management, Professional Marketing of Hair Transplantation, Professional Ethics, Emergency Preparedness in Hair Transplant Surgery Practice, Advanced Cardiac Life Support, Hair Restoration Surgery Office Design, Hair Restoration Surgery Tea Management, Complication Management, Hair Transplant Fellowship Instructor Training. Dr. Puig is a Fellow of the American Academy of Cosmetic Surgery, Fellow of the International Society of Hair Restoration Surgery, and the Diplomate, and the past President of the American Board of Hair Restoration Surgery. Dr. Puig is a clinical instructor in hair restoration surgery at the Baylor Facial Plastic Surgery Center, in Houston. Dr. Puig has had a special interest in Continuous Quality Improvement and the application of Six Sigma Principles to Hair Restoration Surgery for nearly 15 years. He has studied with W. Edwards Deming and other authorities on this topic. Dr. Puig has served as chair of the International Society of Hair Restoration Surgery Fellowship Training Committee, helping to complete the new Guidelines for International Society of Hair Restoration Surgery Fellowship Training Programs and expanding the available programs from three to seven during his tenure; he also has chaired the Core Curriculum Committee, and the International Society of Hair Restoration Surgery Task Force for Physician and Assistant Education. Dr. Puig is currently the immediate Past President of the International Society of Hair Restoration Surgery Board of Governors.

Nicole E. Rogers, MD

Dr. Nicole Rogers is a board certified dermatologist and fellow of both the American Academy of Dermatology and the International Society of Hair Restoration Surgery. She is in private practice in New Orleans, Louisiana where she specializes in all forms of hair loss and scalp disorders, as well as performing hair transplant surgery. She is an Assistant Clinical Professor at Tulane School of Medicine for the Department of Dermatology. This year she will be heading up the CARF newsletter.
