Marc R Avram MD is Clinical Professor of Dermatology at Weill Cornell Medical College and in private practice in New York City. He has authored five textbooks on hair and cosmetic dermatology and serves on the editorial boards of several peer-reviewed journals, and has shared his expertise hundreds of times as an invited lecturer at professional meetings worldwide.

Wilma F. Bergfeld, MD

Cleveland Clinic. Wilma Fowler Bergfeld, MD, F.A.C.P., is Past Head of the Section of Dermatopathology in the Department of Pathology and Staff Dermatologist and Past Head of the Section of Dermatological Research in the Department of Dermatology at Cleveland Clinic. In addition, she is the Director of Cleveland Clinic's Dermatopathology Fellowship and Professor of Dermatology and Pathology at the Cleveland Clinic Educational Foundation. Dr. Bergfeld's specialty interests include hair disorders, photoaging and cosmetic dermatology. In 1996, she received the Women's Dermatological Association Rose Hirschler Award honoring an outstanding physician who has contributed to medicine and dermatology while enhancing the role of women in the field of Dermatology. She received the American Academy of Dermatology's prestigious Marion B. Sulzberger Award in 1997 and was the recipient of the AAD Golden Triangle Award 2000 for Community Service. In 2000, she was the first recipient of the Wilma F Bergfeld MD Leadership Award, presented by the Women's Dermatology Society. In 2005, the Cleveland Academy of Medicine awarded her the "John Budd, MD, Distinguished Member Award. The American Society Dermatopathology in 2007 awarded her the prestigious "Founders Award" and she was elected 2009 President of the American Society of Dermatopathology. Dr. Bergfeld has received many AAD Presidential citations that have included Leadership in AAD Communications and the Volunteer Circle. In 2008, she was awarded Marian Duran Metal, awarded by the International Society of Dermatology. Since 1995, she has been cited in "Best Doctors in America," "Top Doctors," "Top Pathologist," and in numerous Who's Who publications. Dr. Bergfeld is the author of more than 600 publications, three books and 65 book chapters. She has served on many editorial journal boards and has been a reviewer in the both her professional fields of clinical dermatology and dermatopathology.

Lori Bertella

Lori Bertella is a CICAL patient and is passionate about speaking on the topic. She leads a support group in her hometown of Pittsburgh, PA. Dr. Boh completed an internship in Internal Medicine at Tulane University School of Medicine and her residency in Dermatology at University of Texas Southwestern Medical School and served as chief resident. She has served on numerous committees of the AAD, including the Editorial Board of the JAAD. She is a member of the American Dermatological Association (ADA). She serves on the Medical Board of the National Psoriasis Foundation and is a Senior Deputy Editor of the Psoriasis Forum, a publication of the NPF. Currently, Dr. Boh serves on the Board of Directors of the American Academy of Dermatology. Dr. Boh has been named consistently as one of America's Top Doctors by Castle Connolly and Best Doctors in America for 7 years as well as Best Doctors in Louisiana and New Orleans for over 10 years. Dr. Boh has many peer review publications and has written chapters in 6 books on Psoriasis, T-cell lymphoma, Xanthoma, Photosensitivity and Photoaging. She is Principal Investigator of numerous clinical trials, including Psoriasis, Psoriatic Arthritis, Atopic Dermatitis and T-cell lymphomas.

Caroline A. Campion, MD

Caroline A. Campion, MD is an Assistant Professor of Clinical Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences at Tulane University School of Medicine. She received her MD and MPH&TM from Tulane School of Medicine and Tulane School of Public Health respectively. Dr. Dy has expertise in hair disorders, scalp diseases and ethnic and skin and scalp conditions. With her expertise in dermatopathology, Dr. Dy 's medical practice provides a combined clinical and histologic approach in diagnosing hair and scalp diseases in all skin types. Dr. Dy received her BS degree, Magna Cum Laude, in Biomedical Sciences and an Master's in Science with highest distinction in Biological Sciences from Western Michigan Univeristy. She obtained her medical degree from the highly regarded McMaster University Medical School in Ontario, Canada. She joined the Department of Dermatology at RUSH University Medical Center in 2003. Since her appointment Dr. Dy has lectured and presented nationally on various topics on hair. She has also published numerous articles and has written book chapter on the biology of hair, ethnic hair and office diagnosis of hair shaft disorders. Dr. Dy is fluent in various Chinese dialects as well as Tagalog, the native language of the Philippines.

Ronda Farah, MD

Dr. Farah is Director of Medical Dermatology at the University of Minnesota Health (UMN) Maple Grove Clinics and the founder and Director of the UMN Health Cosmetic Center, Dermatology. The comprehensive center is a unique multidisciplinary collaboration including cosmetic dermatology, plastic surgery, oculoplastics and otolaryngology. Dr. Farah serves on the American Academy of Dermatology's Diversity (AAD) Task Force and the Women's Dermatologic Society Academic Dermatologists Committee. She has received numerous grants including those from the Minnesota Medical Foundation and North American Hair Research Society along with investigator-initiated pharmaceutical based funding. Dr. Farah has numerous peer-reviewed publications and lectures on international platforms. Her professional interests also include teaching and healthcare-related quality improvement.

Patricia Farris, MD

Dr. Patricia K. Farris is a board certified dermatologist and nationally recognized expert on anti-aging therapies. She is a well-recognized authority on cosmeceuticals and topical skin care, and has published and lectured extensively on these subjects. She is editor and contributor to the textbook Cosmeceuticals in Cosmetic Practice (Wiley Publishing 2014). She has influenced both product development and overall strategic direction by serving as a consultant to cosmetic companies including Revlon, Neutrogena, Nivea, and L'Oreal. Dr. Farris is known for her interest in the emerging field of nutricosmetics, which explores the role of nutrition and nutritional supplements for improving appearance. In her practice she uses nutritional approaches to treat conditions like acne and as part of a comprehensive anti-aging treatment regimen. She is co-chair of the American Academy of Dermatology's work group on complementary and alternative medicine. Her book The Sugar Detox (De Capo Press, 2013) offers a combined nutrition and skin care program designed to prevent premature aging, weight gain and health problems that are caused by excessive sugar consumption. The Sugar Detox has been featured on Dr. Oz, Access Hollywood Live and Better TV, Great Day Houston and Sirius XM Doctor Radio. Dr. Farris is a media expert for the American Academy of Dermatology and has appeared numerous health-related television segments on dermatology including appearances on CNN, NBC News, The Tyra Banks Show, Good Morning America, and Sirius XM Radio. She is a regular guest and contributor for WWL Eyewitness Morning News (CBS affiliate). Dr Farris has been quoted extensively in newspaper and magazines including The Wall Street Journal, New York Times, Allure, Prevention, O Magazine, Elle, Shape, W Magazine, In Style, New Beauty, Real Simple and Good Housekeeping.. She has been chosen as one of America's Top Doctors, and voted by readers of New Orleans' Gambit Magazine as Top Dermatologist in New Orleans. She received her medical degree and completed residency training in dermatology at Tulane University where she served as chief resident. Dr. Farris is a fellow of the American Academy of Dermatology and member of the American Society of Dermatologic Surgery, American Society for Laser Medicine and Surgery, International Society for Cosmetic Dermatology, American Dermatologic Association and The Women's Dermatologic Society. She has over 25 years of clinical and research experience and is an active member of the teaching faculty at Tulane University.

Lynne J. Goldberg, MD

Dr. Lynne Goldberg is Professor of Dermatology and Pathology and Laboratory Medicine at Boston University School of Medicine. She is triple boarded in internal medicine, dermatology and dermatopathology, and divides her time evenly between the practices of dermatology and dermatopathology. In addition to signing out cases at the Skin Pathology Laboratory at Boston University, she directs the Hair Clinic at Boston Medical Center. Her clinical practice is limited to patients with hair disorders. She is a scientific advisor to CARF and on the editorial board of the Journal of Cutaneous Pathology. She is an avid teacher and lecturer and is the recipient of several teaching awards.

Debra A. Guastella

Debra has been practicing permanent cosmetics and paramedical tattooing in the Greater New Orleans area for over 15 years. She started her permanent cosmetic career in 1995 in a prominent plastic surgeon's office until 2005, when she opened the Guastella Institute for Permanent & Corrective Cosmetics, one of the few stand alone permanent cosmetic facilities in the state. She is a certified permanent cosmetic technician and licensed through the State of Louisiana. Debra served as a Board of Director for 5 years for the Society of Permanent Cosmetic Professionals, the largest governing organization in the permanent cosmetic industry globally. She now serves as the SPCP Convention Coordinator, Louisiana state delegate and Convention Emcee. She has traveled to Brazil, Belgium, Canada, Puerto Rico, Mexico and many locations in the US teaching fundamental and advanced training, specializing in areola repigmentation procedures. Last year she presented to the American Society of Plastic Surgical Nurses convention in Chicago. In 2004 she was recognized as outstanding business women of the year. She has been a featured segment for both ABC and NBC local news stations. Debra has been on the cover of many local magazines and newspapers for both permanent cosmetic procedures and paramedical tattooing. Katherine Ziblich Holcomb, MD

Dr. Katherine Ziblich Holcomb, board certified dermatologist, joined the Lupo Center for Aesthetic and General Dermatology in August 2012. Dr. Holcomb practices the full range of medical, surgical and aesthetic dermatology. She is a clinical assistant professor of dermatology at Tulane University School of Medicine where she supervises the residents cosmetic injectables. Dr. Holcomb has specialized training in patch testing, contact dermatitis and treating ethnic skin types. She is an advocate for sun protection and has organized a number of free skin cancer screenings sponsored by the American Academy of Dermatology. A native New Orleanian and valedictorian of her graduating class at Dominican High School, Dr. Holcomb received a full scholarship to Tulane University where she attained a bachelor of science in cellular and molecular biology from Newcomb College and then a master's of science in public health. She assisted with medical research in Indonesia the year before attending medical school. Dr. Holcomb graduated from Tulane University School of Medicine in 2004 with the Mark Gibbs III graduation award and stayed at Tulane to complete her internal medicine internship. She concluded her dermatology training in New York City at Saint Luke's-Roosevelt Hospital of Columbia University College of Physicians and Surgeons in 2008 and was elected chief resident in her final year. Dr. Holcomb received a number of scholarships during her residency and was able to train with dermatology experts in Florida, New York, Scotland and New Orleans. After graduating from residency, Dr. Holcomb entered active duty with the U.S. Navy to fulfill her commitment for the Health Professions Scholarship Program. Dr. Holcomb served as a clinical professor and staff dermatologist for the National Capital Consortium Dermatology Residency at Walter Reed Army Medical Center in Washington, D.C., and the National Naval Medical Center in Bethesda, Maryland. She completed her service in the U.S. Navy in July 2012 caring for the Marine Corps at Camp Lejeune and received an honorable discharge as a lieutenant commander. Dr. Holcomb is a member of the American Academy of Dermatology, American Society of Dermatologic Surgeons, North American Contact Dermatitis Society and the Women's Dermatologic Society, for which she has served on a number of committees. She is happy to be home in New Orleans where she currently serves Tulane Medical Alumni Association Board. Dr. Holcomb enjoys cooking, traveling, bike riding and being active outdoors with her husband and two sons, Paul and Christopher.

Maria Hordinsky, MD

Dr. Hordinsky is nationally and internationally recognized for her expertise and research in hair diseases and the peripheral nervous system as it relates to hair follicle biology.
